Colyton Grammar School SEX AND RELATIONSHIPS EDUCATION POLICY

Rationale

• Every student is entitled to a relevant sex education programme to aid both personal and social education and to be aware that successful adulthood includes understanding the responsible and constructive use of sexuality.

Aims

- To promote an awareness of personal responsibility in relationships.
- To promote an understanding of sexual attitudes.
- To ensure knowledge and understanding of relevant laws.
- To foster a confident and positive attitude about the physical, emotional and moral aspects of sexual maturity.
- To foster respect for others which is free of prejudice and stereotypes.

Objectives

- Knowledge and understanding about male and female puberty, menstruation, sexual physiology, contraception and STIs.
- Exploration of personal attitudes and those of others.
- To develop skills of listening and communicating, together with empathy and tolerance.
- To enable students to make informed and responsible decisions.
- To promote the importance of personal safety.

Context

- The Sex Education programme is delivered through Science, PSHE and Religious Education.
- To aid coherence and consistency and to target relevant staff development support specific to sex education, it is only taught in the identified contexts.
- Through the Parents' Handbook, all parents are informed of the programme and their right to withdraw their child from specific features of it and targeted e-Communications

Guidance

• Individual guidance is available in school through the School Nursing service under the auspices of the Area Health Authority.

Co-ordination

- The Assistant Head and Head of Student Personal Learning are responsible for coordinating and developing the programme and for periodic evaluation within the 3year development cycle.
- The Evaluation Report will be considered by the ALS Committee of the Board of Governors.
